SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 **Senator John A. Cade Memorial Highway**

3 FOR the purpose of dedicating the Maryland portion of Interstate Route 97 in  
4 memory of the late Senator John A. Cade; and requesting the State Highway  
5 Administration to take all necessary steps, in consultation with appropriate  
6 federal highway officials, to place a sign or other appropriate memorial  
7 declaring that Interstate Route 97 is dedicated by the State of Maryland in  
8 memory of Senator John A. Cade.

9 WHEREAS, John A. Cade served in the Senate of Maryland with unparalleled  
10 distinction from 1975 to 1996 and through his service brought great honor to the  
11 Senate and the State; and

12 WHEREAS, Senator Cade was greatly respected by members of the General  
13 Assembly, his constituents, and citizens throughout the State for his legendary  
14 mastery of the complexities of legislation, budgets, and public policy, his strong and  
15 fair leadership, and his commitment to the State of Maryland and the service of its  
16 citizens; and

17 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland wishes to express its profound  
18 respect for, and deep gratitude to, Senator John A. Cade, and to establish an  
19 appropriate, lasting memorial to Senator Cade in honor of his dedicated service to the  
20 State of Maryland; and

1 WHEREAS, Senator Cade played an instrumental role in promoting, planning,  
2 funding, and ensuring completion of Interstate Route 97, a segment of which runs  
3 between U.S. Route 50 and New Cut Road in Legislative District 33, the district  
4 Senator Cade represented since its creation; now, therefore, be it

5 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the  
6 Maryland portion of Interstate Route 97 be dedicated to the memory of the late  
7 Senator John A. Cade; and be it further

8 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of Maryland requests the State  
9 Highway Administration to take all necessary steps, in consultation with appropriate  
10 federal highway officials, to erect a suitable sign or other memorial declaring that the  
11 Maryland portion of I-97 is dedicated by the State of Maryland in memory of Senator  
12 John A. Cade; and be it further
